# estate tax when the valuation date falls on a weekend"

We've received a few questions lately regarding this situation. People are sometimes surprised we are only reporting the Friday price instead of the Monday and Friday prices they are expecting. Here is the IRS regulation we follow: [ IRS Reg. 20.2031-8(3)(b) ] For open ended investment companies (commonly known as mutual funds) the fair market price is the public redemption price on the valuation date.
